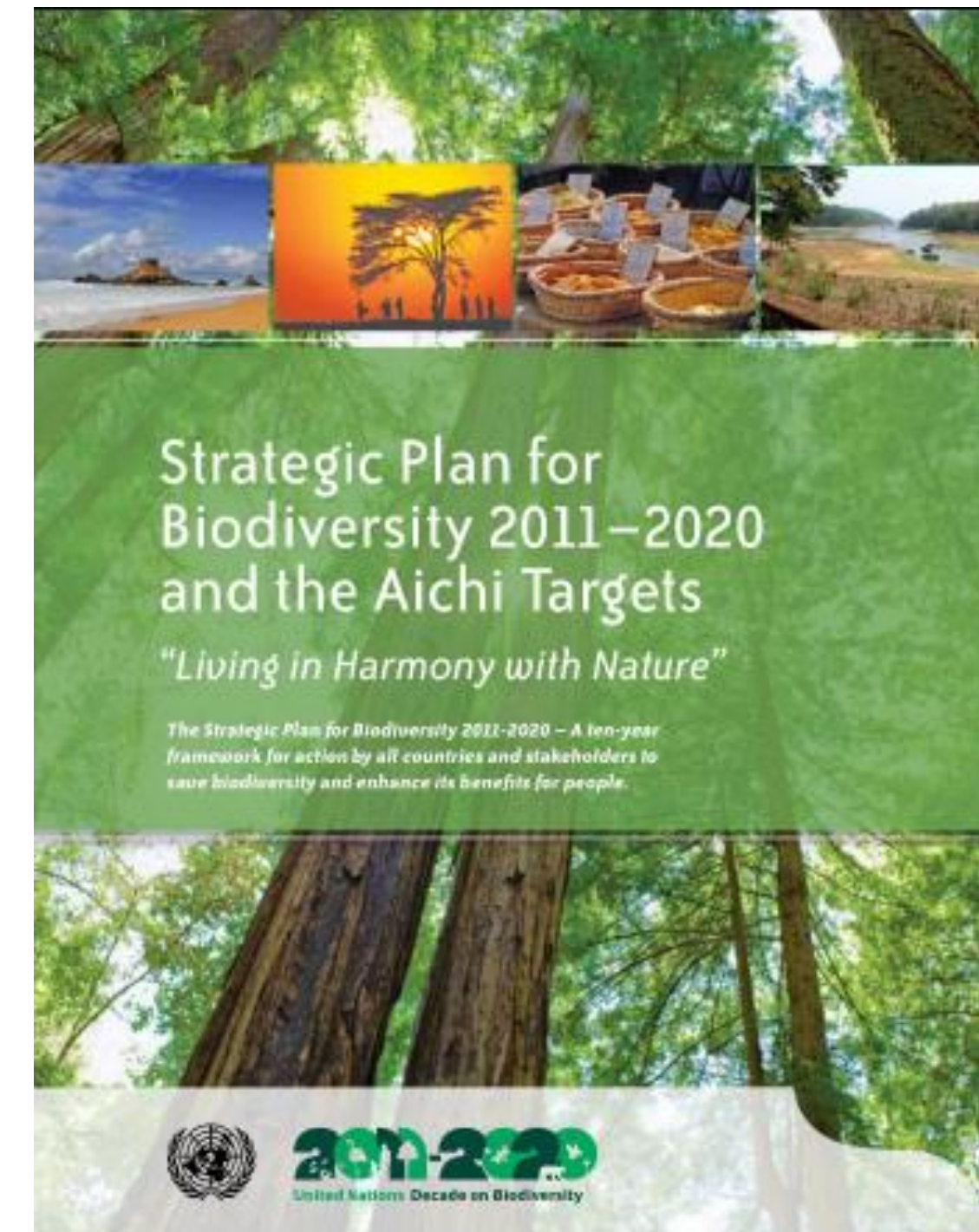
# UNEP-WCMC support to intergovernmental agreements

- Support countries in effectively implementing biodiversity-related conventions and processes
- Provide support to the secretariats, governance and advisory bodies of the biodiversity-related conventions and processes in addressing their mandates
- Play a substantive role in supporting development of the post-2020 biodiversity agenda at global, regional and national levels

# Post-2020 global biodiversity framework

## What is the post-2020 global biodiversity framework?

- Follow-up to the current Strategic Plan for Biodiversity 2011-2020
- Anticipated that the post-2020 global biodiversity framework will be adopted at COP15 in China in 2020



# Post-2020 global biodiversity framework

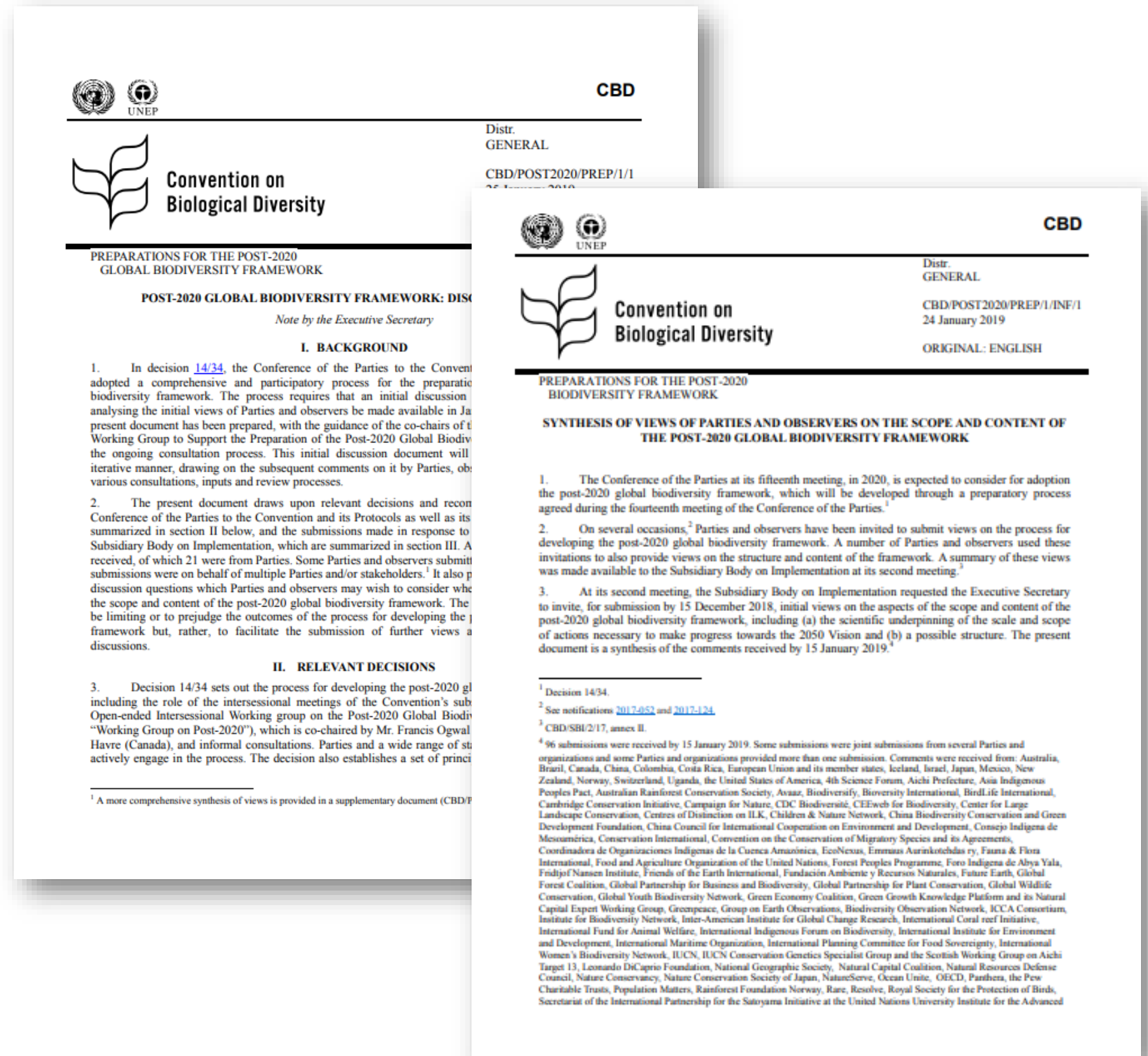
## Why is it relevant to Proteus Partners?

- Provide context, direction and targets for national and international action on biodiversity up to 2030
- Inform national policy and action with respect to biodiversity and ecosystem services
- Place biodiversity in the context of other relevant global agendas, increasing coherence in national action
- Provide a framework for action at all levels and in all relevant sectors

# Post-2020 global biodiversity framework

## The Story So Far

- COP14 adopted the *process* for development of the post-2020 global biodiversity framework
- Open-ended working group set up
- Co-chairs appointed (*Basile van Havre* from Canada, and *Francis Ogwal* from Uganda)
- Regional and MEAs consultations



# Post-2020 global biodiversity framework

## It is already understood that...

- The 2050 Vision for Biodiversity remains relevant
  - “by 2050, biodiversity is valued, conserved, restored and wisely used, maintaining ecosystem services, sustaining a healthy planet and delivering benefits essential for all people”*
- The post-2020 global biodiversity framework will address all three objectives of the Convention

# Post-2020 global biodiversity framework

## Key issues under discussion include...

- Level of ambition needed to achieve the 2050 vision for biodiversity
- Integration across all aspects of the Convention and its Protocols
- Structure of the framework, and what mission and targets are needed
- Relationship with other processes, including other conventions and the SDGs
- Mainstreaming and national planning
- Integrating diverse perspectives
- Review and reporting, including indicators
- Voluntary commitments and contributions
- Resource mobilization and capacity-building
- Communication and outreach

# Post-2020 global biodiversity framework

## Key issues identified in the submissions by Parties...

- Submissions were made by:
  - 20 Parties (including the EU and its Member States)
  - 1 non-Party (the USA)
  - 54 observers (including several from networks and multiple organizations)

## Submissions from Parties, other Governments, relevant organizations and indigenous peoples and local communities on the preparations for the Post-2020 Biodiversity Framework

Through [notification 2019-008](#) a [discussion document](#) summarizing and analyzing the initial views of Parties and observers on the post-2020 global biodiversity framework was made available. A supporting [document](#) providing a comparative analysis of the initial views received was also prepared. Through the same notification Parties, other Governments, indigenous peoples and local communities, relevant international organizations, civil society organizations, women's and youth organizations, private and financial sectors and other stakeholders were invited to provide further views on the post-2020 global biodiversity framework by 15 April 2019.

# Post-2020 global biodiversity framework

## Key issues identified in the submissions by Parties...

- Structure – for some, the current strategic goals remain relevant
- Revision of Aichi Biodiversity Targets that have not been met
- Exploring option of defining regional or national targets, indicators and indices



# Post-2020 global biodiversity framework

## Key issues identified in the submissions by Parties...

### Role of the private sector with respect to:

- Development *and subsequent implementation* of the post-2020 global biodiversity sector
- Voluntary commitments
- Mainstreaming
- Financing
- Public-private partnerships
- Attendance at CBD meetings (e.g. COPs, OEWG) – on its own, not sufficient

# Post-2020 global biodiversity framework

## Opportunities for business engagement

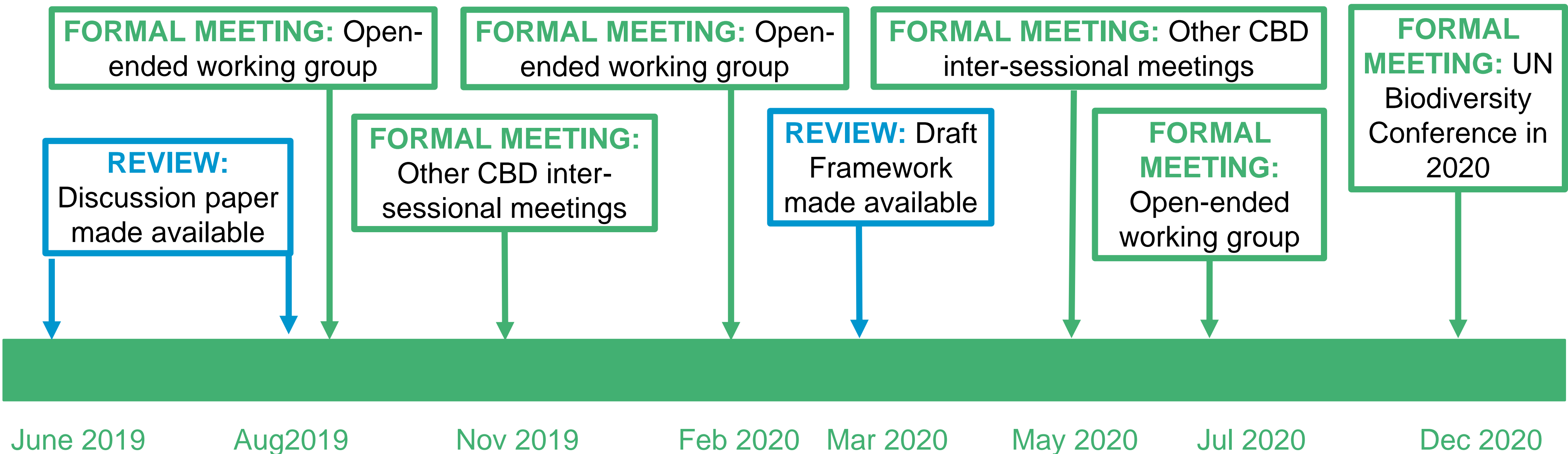
- *Participation in meetings* (formal process and informal consultations)
- *Submission of views* on documents sent out for review
- *Input* into other regional / national meetings and activities
- *Engage* through associations and initiatives

## Key dates

- **2<sup>nd</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> July** – Trondheim Conference
- **15<sup>th</sup> August** – Expected deadline for comments on revised discussion paper
- **27<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> August** – 1<sup>st</sup> meeting of the Open-ended Working Group

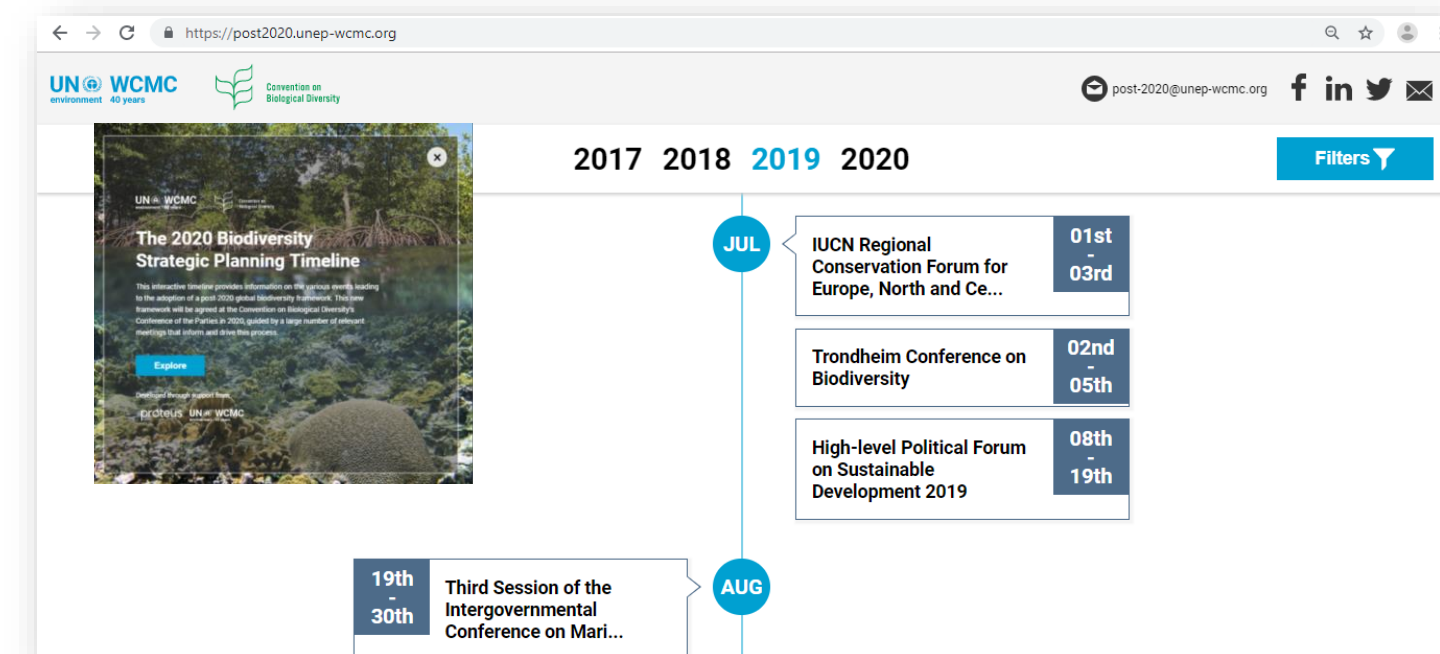

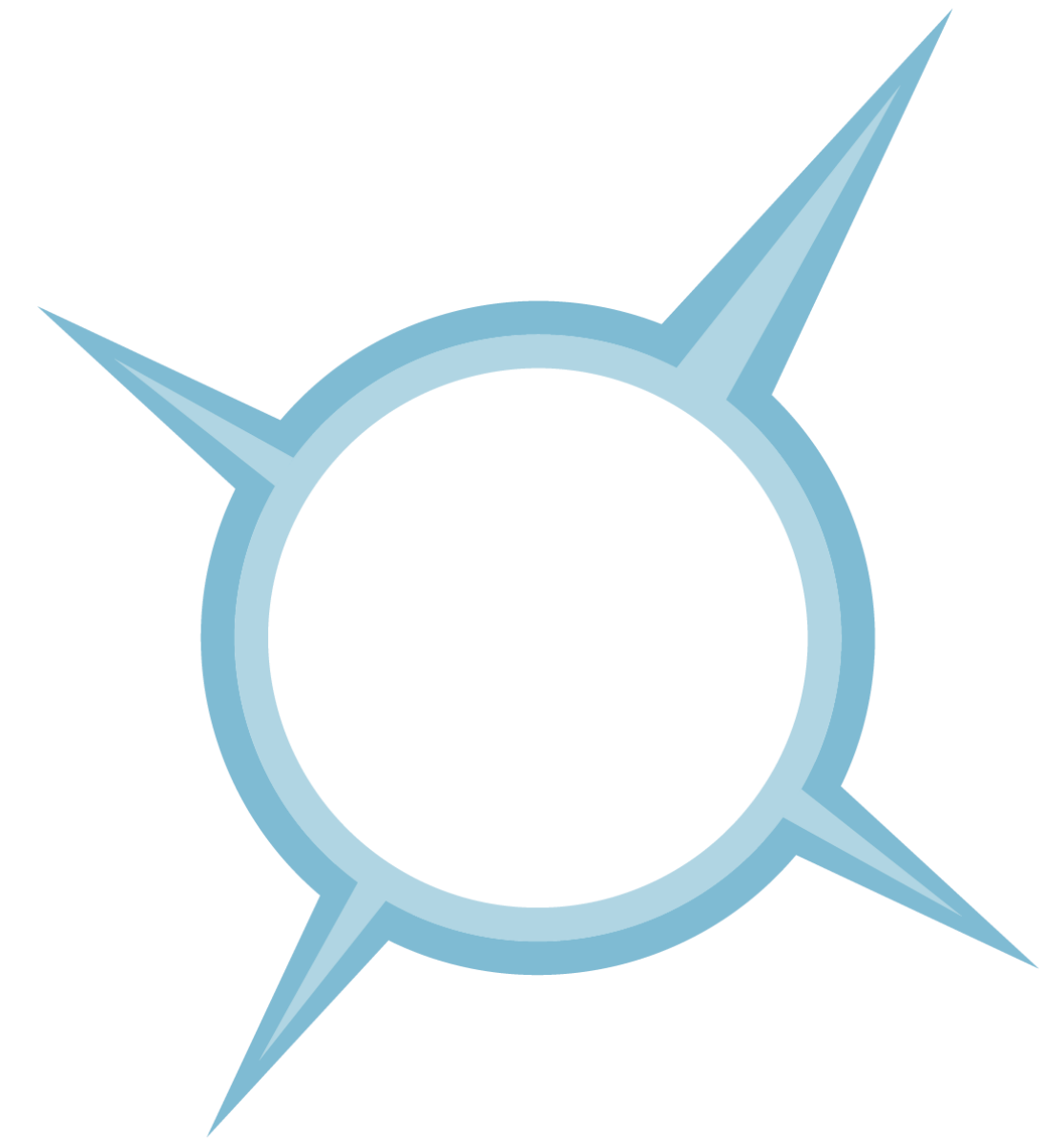
