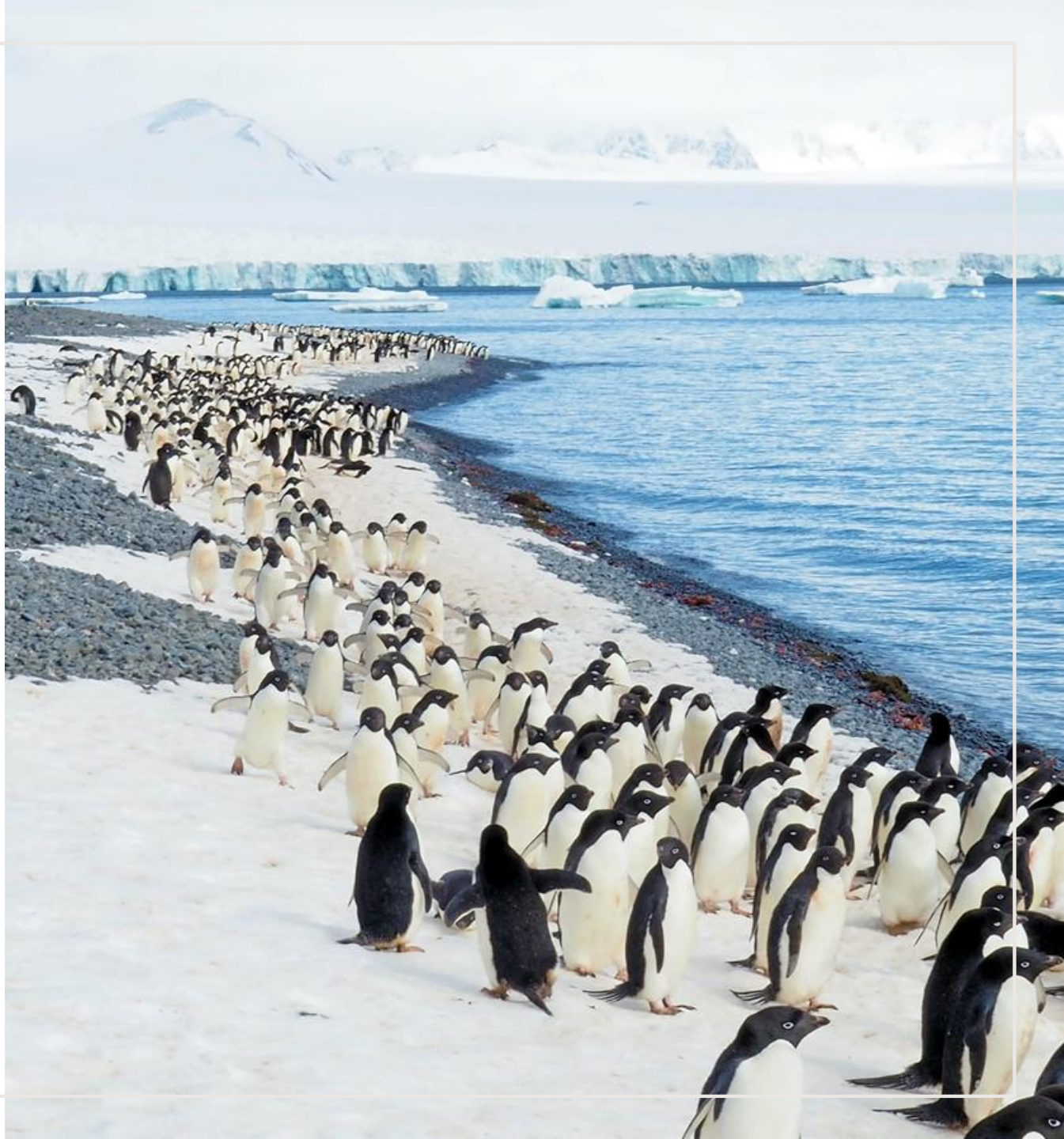

- Revised/updated NBSAPs (use of **headline indicators**)
- Or national targets in *standard format*

Global analysis of information on NBSAPs/national targets from all Parties

- Consideration of global analysis

COP 16 (2024)

National review of progress

- 7<sup>th</sup> national report in *standard format* (28 February 2026) – use of **headline indicators**

- Consideration of global analysis
- Global review of collective progress

COP 17 (2026)

National review of progress

- 8<sup>th</sup> national report in *standard format* (30 June 2029) – use of **headline indicators**

- Consideration of global analysis
- Global review of collective progress

COP 19 (2030)

Post-2030 updates to global biodiversity framework

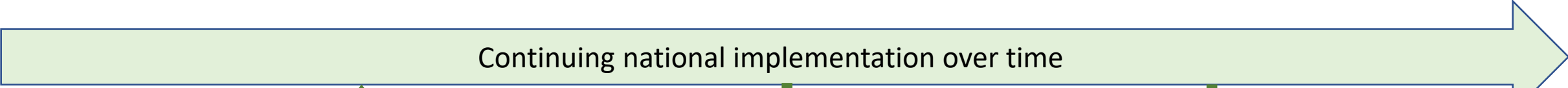

# A MONITORING FRAMEWORK FOR THE KUNMING - MONTREAL GLOBAL BIODIVERSITY FRAMEWORK

- The monitoring framework includes a set of headline (26 in total), component and complementary indicators
- Parties are urged to use the headline indicators for planning purposes, and requested to use them for reporting at national level
- Parties can also use national, component and complementary indicators, depending on national needs
- Some of the indicators in the monitoring framework are yet to be fully developed – this applies to the indicator for Target 15, on impacts and dependencies on biodiversity
- Work is underway to finalise these indicators and more information will be provided in follow up presentations

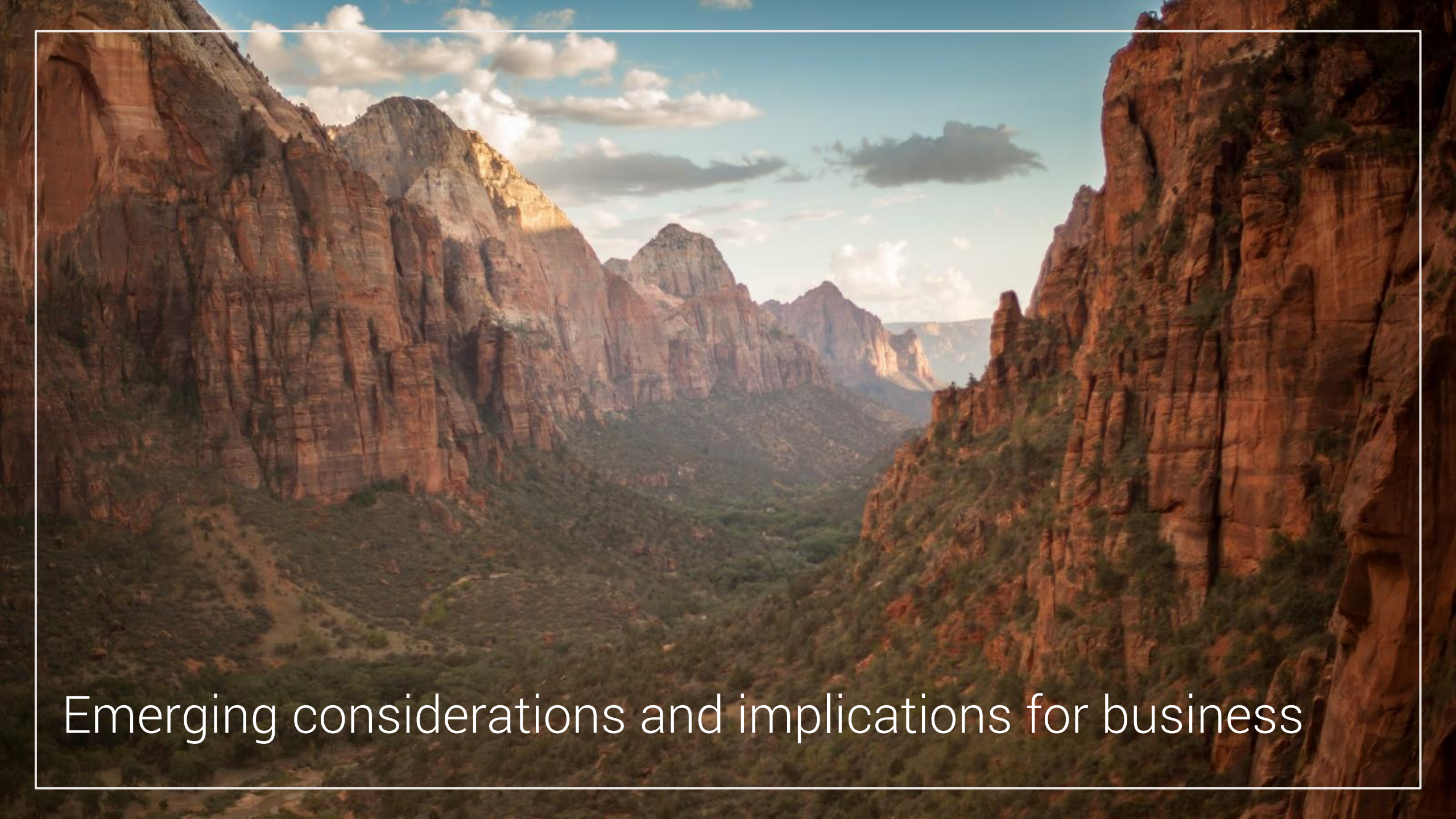

## Goal D

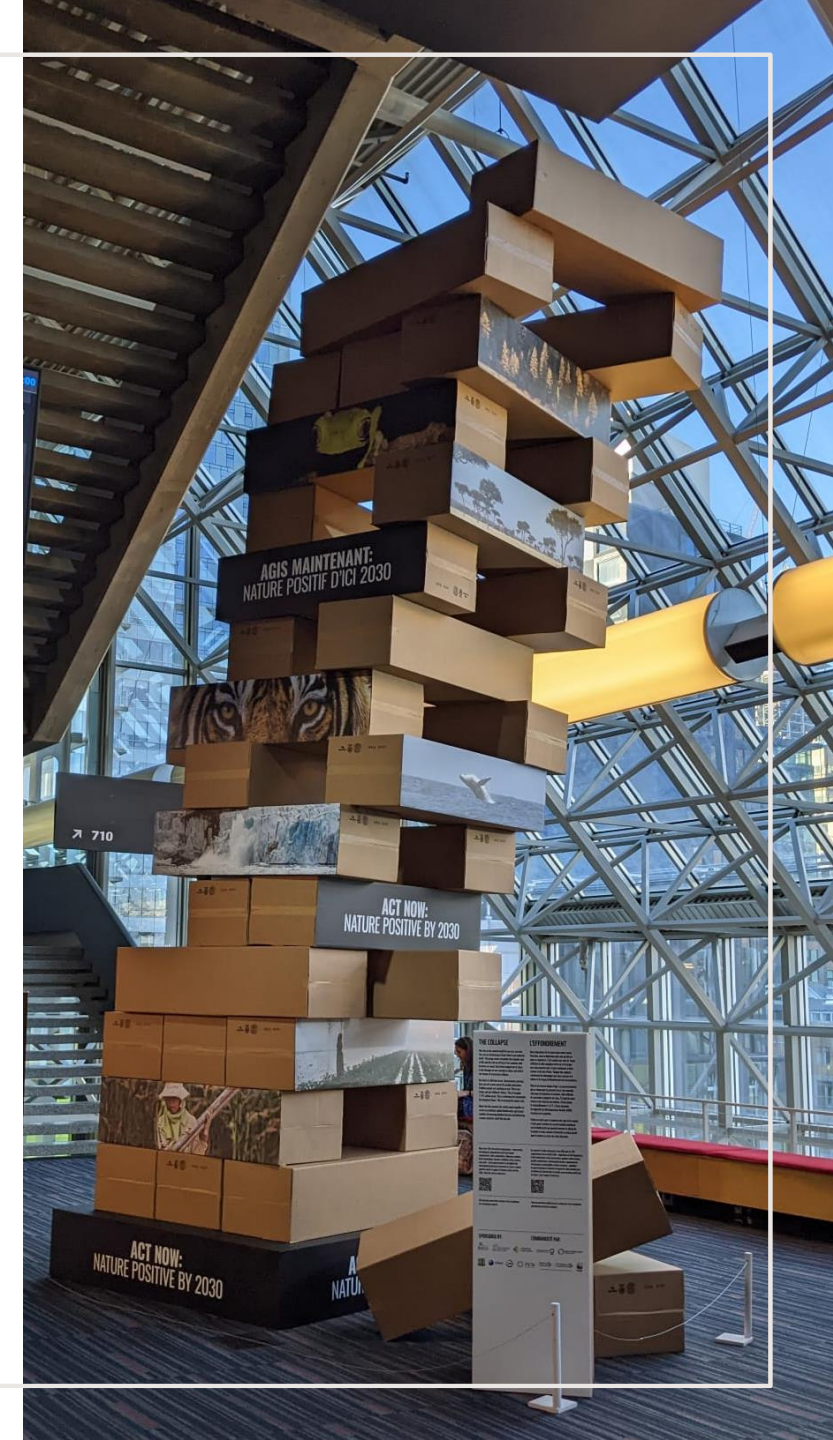
Adequate means of implementation (including financial resources and capacity building)

- Tools and solutions for implementation and mainstreaming

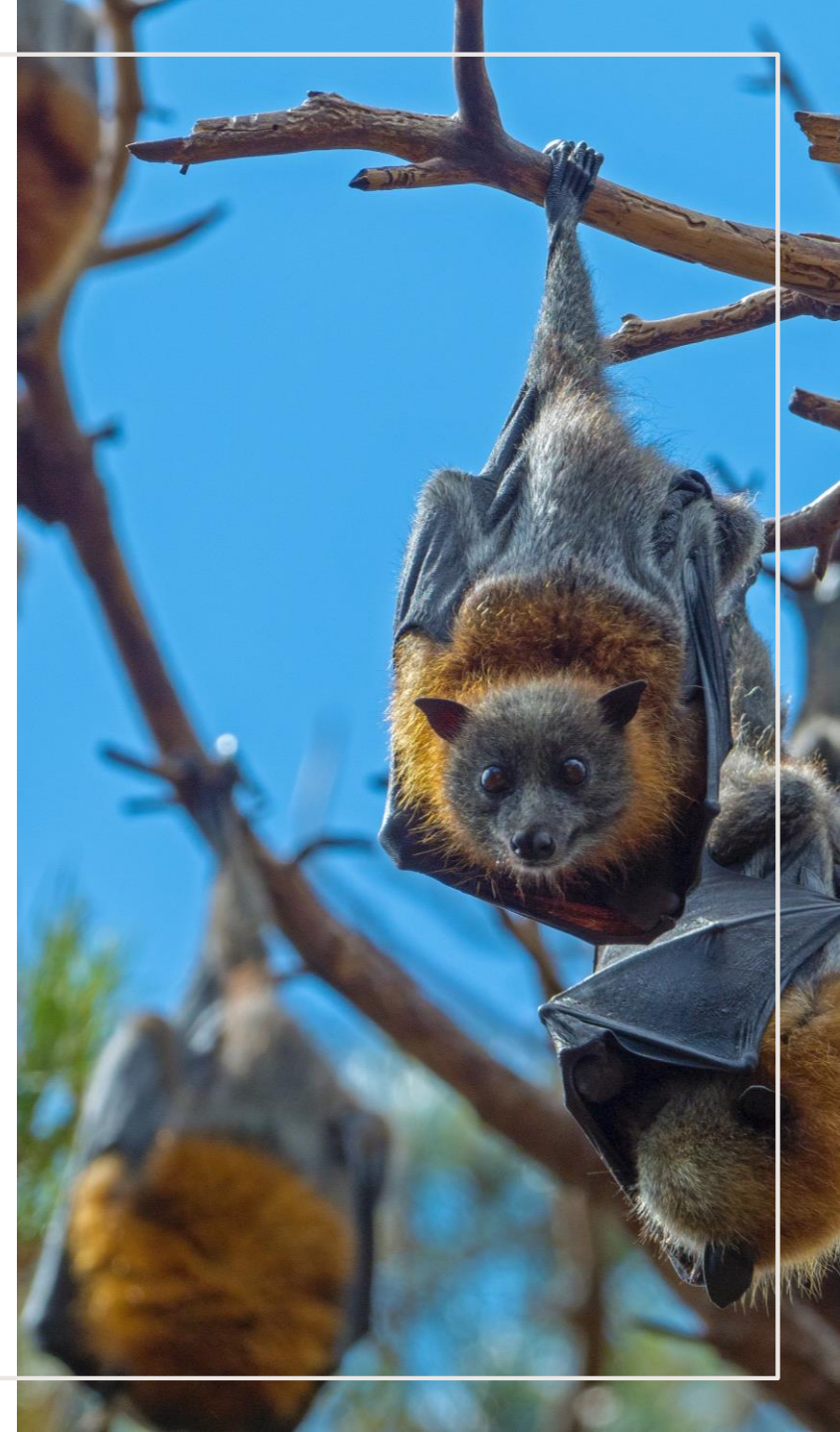
# EMERGING CONSIDERATIONS AND IMPLICATIONS FOR BUSINESS

- Reducing pressures and drivers for change to halt and reverse biodiversity loss
- Opportunities to align business strategies and commitments with global goals
- Mechanisms and data for assessing materiality and supporting disclosure across operations and supply chains
- Emerging regulatory requirements as part of revised ESIA's or permitting processes
